Central America is an isthmus. An isthmus is a neck of land that connects two larger landmasses. In the case of Central America, it is an isthmus that connects North and South America.



In Central America, three main climates are tropical rain forest, tropical savanna, and highland in the mountains. The tropical rain forest and tropical savanna both have year-round high temperatures and lots of rain. The tropical rain forest has rain in every month without a dry season. The vegetation consists of trees, which are home to many animal varieties. The tropical savanna has much rain in summer, but winters are dry. The vegetation is usually shrubs and tall grass. The highland climate is much cooler and milder than the very warm temperatures and rainy climate of the tropical rain forest and tropical savanna.

Central American countries are all in the tropics. Except in the mountains, the tropics are a region of year-round warm temperatures. Those regions with abundant rain year-round have winds that blow toward the shore throughout the year. The winds blow onshore and rise over the mountains, producing abundant rain. Those regions with a wet season followed by a dry season have winds blowing from over the water toward the shore in the wet season. In the dry season, the winds blow from over the land toward the water.
